

2021 COVID-19 Guidelines at Camp Lutherwood Oregon

Updated: 5/27/2021

** PLEASE NOTE:

- "Camper" includes all family campers (adults and children) and women's retreat attendees.
- These guidelines will continue to be updated as new information becomes available. The most current versions will be available on our website at lutherwoodoregon.org and will be sent to all registered participants prior to their arrival.

1. Campers - Before Arrival to Camp

- a. Recommend limiting exposure for the two weeks prior to camp for all who are attending a camp session, including families & youth campers (be mindful of risk and stay local) AND
- b. Proof of negative COVID test taken 1-3 days prior to arrival for all attending camp over the age of 5 (testing resources can will be provided for location ideas of testing if needed) OR
- c. Proof of Vaccination (A copy must be either submitted prior to arrival or brought to camp with you)

2. The Camp Week

- a. Registration & pick up for youth programs will be a numbered parking system in the front of camp. No parents will exit cars. Port-a-Potties will be provided.
- b. Family Camp arrival will be staggered and staffed accordingly.
- c. Daily Schedule will include:
 - i. Daily Camper screening with counselor (before breakfast). Any "fail" screening reports immediately to Cacara. Recorded on a clipboard each day and kept for 4 weeks.
 - ii. Intentional hand washing & water bottle filling stops during the day (prior to meals, after high touch activities, etc)
 - iii. Intentional activities where campers maintain distance between other campers.
- d. Campers will be in cohorts of 30 maximum (each camp session has a limited registration capacity of 30 campers).
- e. Campers will spend most of their time with their own cabin group (6-8 campers) and one Buddy Cabin (total of 12-16 campers). All meals and activities will take place within their cohort.
- f. Meals
 - i. Campers will eat in cabin groups either outdoors or distanced in the dining hall. Cohorts may have separate/staggered meal times.
- g. Cabins
 - i. Cabin spaces are limited to half capacity when possible. All campers will sleep at least 30" apart and head-to-toe with fans, open windows & screen doors.

- h. Swimming Pool
 - i. Campers will stay distanced in the swimming pool and groups will be kept small while using the pool.
 - i. Health & Wellness
 - i. Camp will follow all procedures as outlined in Lutherwood's Communicable Disease Plan including what happens if campers or staff exhibit symptoms, testing, plans for sending campers and staff home in case of COVID exposure
 - ii. Camper and Staff logs will be kept in Cascara including information required by the OHA and daily health checks.
 - j. Masks
 - i. Campers & staff must wear a mask at all times indoors and when doing an activity outside where they may come within 6' of others from a different cohort.
3. Staff
- a. Vaccinations are highly recommended for all staff, proof of vaccination will be kept in staff files.
 - b. A negative test is required prior to coming to camp if not vaccinated.
 - c. Training includes: communication of symptoms, exposure risks, work accommodations for a COVID diagnosis and guidelines for mitigation.
 - d. Vaccinated staff are not required to wear a mask.
 - e. Staff are required to wear a mask when indoors and in crowded outdoor spaces.
 - f. Staff will remain on site (except for medical emergencies) during the camp week. During time off, staff will be encouraged to stay onsite but when leaving should follow all state and local COVID-19 mitigation guidelines to minimize their exposure.
 - g. Staff will self-screen daily for COVID-19 symptoms, reporting any to Cascara immediately.
4. The Camp Site will:
- a. Provide easily accessible hand sanitizer, hand washing stations & opportunities, tissues & garbage receptacles.
 - b. Provide fans and screen doors for all cabins and restrooms
 - c. Provide extra masks for those who forget or have lost theirs. Sell masks in the Trading Post for campers who want to purchase extras.
 - d. Set up a space for any campers who develop symptoms at camp to be isolated from others that is located outside of Cascara.
 - e. Cleaning
 - i. Frequently/after every activity- high touch surfaces
 - ii. Daily- all restrooms
 - iii. Regular- play structures
