According to the Clackamas Soil and Water Conservation District's website, an ecoregion is a large area defined by the range of species or environmental conditions present. Camp is located right between the Coast Range and the Willamette Valley where low coastal mountains ecoregions are nearby: the dry ridges



of the Klamath Mountains and the alpine peaks of the West Cascades. This unique location gives camp great environmental diversity for all campers and guests to explore.

With many different types of environments around camp, there

is the opportunity to see interactions in plants and animals that you might not be able to see in other parts of the state. Camp hosts a variety of plants ranging from large conifers like the Douglas Fir to small stream bushes like Osoberry. When it comes to animals, camp is home to squirrels, bats, beetles, among many others, and even the occasional camper!

# S'MORES SNICKERDOODLES

A Registration Day at camp (traditionally Sundays) isn't complete without a freshly-baked cookie and cold glass of lemonade. Try this take on a camp classic: S'mores snickerdoodles.

Be sure to tag us on social media to show off your batch!

1 cup unsalted butter (softened)

1½ cups sugar

2 large eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla

2 3/4 cup flour

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon cream of tartar (for less tang, use 1 teaspoon)



½ teaspoon baking soda1 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup chocolate chips

1/4 cup mini marshmallows

1 cup ground graham crackers

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- In a large mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar together for 4-5 minutes until light and fluffy.
   Scrape the sides of the bowl and add the eggs and vanilla. Cream for 1-2 minutes longer.
- 3. Stir in flour, cream of tartar, baking soda, and salt, just until combined.
- 4. Fold in chocolate chips and mini marshmallows.
- 5. Put ground graham crackers in a small bowl.
- 6. If time allows, wrap the dough and let it refrigerate for 20-30 minutes.
- 7. Roll into small balls until round and smooth. Drop into the ground graham crackers and coat well. Using a spoon, coat for a second time, ensuring the cookie balls are completely covered. (To make flatter snickerdoodles, press down in the center of the ball before placing in the oven. This helps to keep them from puffing up in the middle.)
- Place on a parchment paper-lined baking sheet.
   Bake for 9-11 minutes. Let cool for several minutes on a baking sheet before removing from the pan.
